"OTHER DUTIES AS ASSIGNED"

- Examples of the "other duties" of RSO Advising
 - Mediation
 - Motivation
 - Facilitation
 - Recognition
 - Guidance

"OTHER DUTIES AS ASSIGNED"

- Advising an RSO often involves extra hours and extra effort
 - Attending meetings
 - Assisting with event planning
 - Mediating conflicts within the organization
- Advisor involvement directly correlates with RSO success.
- Advisor involvement also typically correlates with RSO morale.
- While there is no "requirement" for extra commitment, it is highly encouraged and appreciated.

BUILDING A RELATIONSHIP

- A successful advisor will develop a working relationship with RSO members.
 - Leadership/Executive members vs. general membership
 - Monitoring and balancing the workload (co-curricular activities)
 - Contributing to organization cohesion
- Being friendly vs. being their friend
 - Importance of developing rapport with students
 - Importance of maintaining professional separation
